



Rubber Surfacing Cleaning and Maintenance

Get Started Right Away

For the most part, poured in place rubber is a self-sufficient and relatively maintenance-free surfacing. However, depending on your location, environmental factors, traffic usage, and outside contaminants, occasional cleaning may be necessary. You may notice stains from spills such as Kool-Aid, sports drinks, etc. or a white film caused by excessive minerals in the water due to your location. In addition, airborne contaminants from locations near beaches, freeways, or northern winters may also require a light surface cleaning. If this is the case for you, we have a solution.

Make It Gorgeous

For general stains and surface cleaning, we recommend a cleaning solution of 1-part cleaning solution such as Soft Scrub with Bleach and 2-parts water. For heavier stains, a 1-part cleaner to 1-part water can be used. We recommend testing this solution on a small area before beginning.

Apply the cleaning solution to area, gently scrub with a stiff bristled brush, rinse well, and repeat as necessary.

Caution!!!! While your rubber surfacing is very durable, it is not indestructible, and it can be damaged with high pressure power washing. Therefore, we typically recommend most cleaning be done with a hose. However, pressure washers may be used with a light spray and on a very low degree. Simply add a gentle soap solution to your power washer and test before using.
